## Outstanding Women of Kansas Awards Judging & Awards Process

The Awards Committee Chair and Vice Chair will Chair each Judging Committee. Industry leaders, statewide senior-level executives, and other interested individuals are invited to apply to join each committee. Each Committee will be comprised of five (5) judges including the Awards Committee Chair and Co-Chair. All judges can apply to judge the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment Centennial Celebration Awards by completing an application online here: <https://19thcentennial.com/judges>. If accepted, they will be assigned categories by the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment Centennial Celebration Awards Committee Chair based on their industry, function, and experience.

During the judging, each entry will be reviewed on a scale of 1-10 for several determining factors. All entries that receive an average score of at least 7.25 when judging is completed, regardless of category, will be considered for interviews. The Awards Committee and judges will select three finalists which best represent each category and interviews will be conducted.

After interviews, each finalist will be scored using the same guidelines and the winner for each category will be selected. Winners will be invited to attend the Awards banquet in Wichita, KS and must be present to win. The winner for each category will be named 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment Centennial Outstanding Woman Award winner in their category with a 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winner.

The winning entry in each category will receive a unique Winged Goddess of Victory Award, hand sculpted by artist Jennie Becker. The 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners will also receive an award. All winners will have the right to promote their winning status.

The veracity of claims made in entries may be audited. Any entry found to contain false or misleading information will be disqualified. All Judges will be published on 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment Centennial web site, social media sites, and state-wide media. Judges will have the opportunity to redact any confidential or non-public information from their entries before publication.
